

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

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

Take the tip Ladies, do not watch this without a tissue on stand by.



PROPOSED WALKING TRACK

It is proposed to establish a 2.5 km walking track around the perimeter of the Macarthur Golf Course. It will be linked to the town via Slaughterhouse Rd and Eversley St to High St. This will link in to the Historical Trail launched last November and also connect to the path that leads to the Recreation Reserve, creating a significant recreational trail in Macarthur.

The path would be 2 metres wide and consist of a limestone base with crushed stone top. This would enable it to be used in various ways by individuals and groups in the community.

The land comes under the umbrella of The Old Racecourse Reserve Committee. As a result a "Friends of the Reserve" has been formed with purpose of establishing and later maintaining the track

Macarthur Community Health with the help of the "Friends" will be applying for a major Grant to help fund this proposal.
